Breakdown of Classification Scores: To find out what your class is: take your score and find out between which two classes your score falls, then choose the class with the slower time in the Division in which you are shooting.

For example: John Booth's score is 138.68 and his score in SSP falls between Expert of 120.0 and 152.73 Sharpshooter and since his score did not go **below** 120.00 on this classifier, he would place as a **Sharpshooter**.

If your score is higher than the highest total (e.g. 195.00 for CDP or 210.00 for SSP) then your classification is **Novice (NOV)**.
